Fellow Lions,

LCIF is our Lions Foundation which allows us to make a powerful impact in changing the world together. Our donations have helped in areas that have been devastated by floods, tornadoes, wars, and fires. In fact, Dawson Springs, Kentucky, was one of the areas where Team Kentucky provided generators and other supplies two years ago. Unfortunately, the town was impacted, again, on Memorial Day weekend. Unfortunately, places like Iowa and Houston have been constantly barraged by Mother Nature during the past few weeks.

However, there seems to be a common misconception that funds collected in the United States are always sent offshore, but that couldn't be further from the truth. 14-E has received funding for flood relief, tornado relief, and Covid 19. In addition, we received \$30,000 for an Eye Mission Trip and more than \$75,000 for various projects for the Westmoreland County Blind Association, as well as \$10,000 for Sight and Hearing Equipment.

For those of you who attended 14-E's Spring Rally, we packed 280 Jared Boxes which was partially supported by an LCIF District and Community Impact Grant. In addition, the Rostraver Township Lions Club will be using their Community Impact Grant funds that were accrued during Campaign 100 to package meals for the Rostraver Township Food Bank.

So, please try to include Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) in your monthly giving. Whether it's \$1, \$5, or more, every penny can change someone's life, perhaps even your own.

Thank you for all that you do, particularly for your financial generosity to LCIF. I was honored to work with you this year and wish you a safe, healthy, and productive summer of service and planning.

Dear Lions and Leos,

Many of us are struggling with the new Lions Portal. However, as I play with it and learn more, I agree that it will be an improvement. We just need to keep an open mind and a positive attitude. Likewise, each day, more information is being uploaded and corrected.

In the meantime, here is a "Cheat Sheet" on how to add club officer information. (I know this should have been reported, but in case it hasn't, it's not too late!)

TO ADD NEW OFFICERS ON LION PORTAL:

From your Home Page, select My Club. Click on Manage Club Officers (blue button). Select Create New Assignment and press Next. Select Upcoming Lion Year and press Next. Select Official or Administrator and press Next. Select Title Type, also Official, and press Next. Select Officer Title from the drop-down list, then Select Active Members and press Next. Add Officer Address, Select No (should already be in LCI), and press Next. Success!

It may take 24 hours to activate entirely. Would you like to create another Officer Title Assignment? Select Yes to add more Officers. Repeat the above actions.

TO ADD NEW MEMBERS:

From the Home Page, select My Club.

Click on Manage Club Members (Blue button).

Click on Add New Member and press Next.

Add the Member's First Name, Last Name, Date of Birth, and Gender, and press Next.

Add Nickname, Emails, Country, Address, City, State, Zip code, Phone Numbers, Occupation, and Spouse/Companion, press Next.

Select Membership Type. Select New Member, Transfer Member, Family Member, Student Member, Current or former LEO, or Young Adult, and press Next.

Select Membership Category. Select Active, Family, Student, Affiliate, Associate, Member at Large, LEO, Honorary, Life, or Privileged, and press Next.

Success!

Again, it may take 24 hours to activate entirely. Would you like to add another New Member? Select Yes to Add New Member. Repeat the above actions.

Select Edit Member, Reinstate Member, Transfer Member, or Drop Member. Follow the prompts.
