URGENT NEED FOR HELP!

The Camps run through the months of June and July. Unfortunately, Beacon Lodge has already canceled two sessions due to lack of staffing.

We've all heard about the "great worker shortage" – everywhere you look, businesses have help wanted signs hanging, and you hear about sign-on bonuses being paid by those who normally don't offer them and unusually high wages being offered. As the State Project that has a large number of workers to hire every year, Beacon Lodge has been impacted by these circumstances. Nursing, Kitchen, and Program departments are all significantly understaffed, despite a lot of effort and funding applied to recruiting.

Scheduled for the 2022 summer are the following sessions: 1 Transitional, 3
Assisted Living, 1 Camp Unite, and 2 Visually Impaired sessions in the Adult Camp and 1 LEAP, 1 Ad(h)dventure, 1 ConnXions, 2 Camp Unite, and 2 Project New

Hope in the Children's Village. Full staffing of the seasonal positions includes 44 workers.

We currently have 13.

Due to the staffing shortage and the Session #1 camper counts in Adult Camp and Children's Village, those sessions have been cancelled. Our campers will be given the option to join a later session. Camp now begins on June 11th.

Please let this serve as the official call for help. We are in critical need of volunteers to make Camp 2022 happen. I'm sure we've all encountered businesses that are closed when they should be open because they don't have the staff to keep their regular hours, and even businesses that have gone under because they cannot pay the high wages job seekers have come to expect. Beacon Lodge is in danger of not being able to serve the Special Needs community this season. This is an opportunity for the Lions of Pennsylvania to show that when circumstances make a project seem impossible, we will be there to find a way to serve those who need it most because where there is a need, there is a Lion.

Your Camp has a need – Let's meet this challenge together.

If you or someone you know has experience in or a desire for helping individuals with special needs, cooking for large groups, or is an LPN/RN please contact us at 814-542-2511 or office@beaconlodge.org today! We need individuals to fill Counselor, Cook, and Nurse positions. All positions require PA ChildLine, State Police Background, and FBI Fingerprint Clearances. Those interested in volunteering as a Counselor will also need CPR/First Aid and Mandated Reporter certifications. All of these can be completed online, except for the CPR/First Aid. We are trying to set up a second training on June 11 at Beacon Lodge. You may also find options available to you locally.

Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check: Free for Volunteers
Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) Criminal History Background Check: \$22.60 for Volunteers

- Use service code "1KG6ZJ" and make an appointment at the location closest to you.
- If you have lived in the state of Pennsylvania for 10+ years, you can complete a waiver in lieu of the Fingerprint clearance. If you have any questions or would like more information about required clearances, please visit KeepKidsSafe.

Counselor DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand Camp Policy and Camp Rules.
- Assist the campers in increasing independence, experiencing community membership, increasing social skills, building peer relationships, and increasing self-confidence.
- Cooperate with the entire staff in working together for the welfare of the camp and campers.
- Supervise and lead small and large group activities.
- Participate in the set-up and cleanup of games and crafts.
- Adapt activities, as needed, to allow active participation by the campers.
- Provide additional assistance (e.g., interpreting instructions, providing physical assistance (including personal care) in order to help the campers learn recreational skills.
- Prepare camper progress reports and award certificates.
- Ensure the facility is clean and safe.
- Other duties as assigned.

Cook DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand and follow all Camp Policies, Camp Rules, DOH guidelines, and ServSafe guidelines.
- Prepare and serve meals.
- Maintain proper food storage.
- Maintain proper leftovers storage and utilization of leftovers per camp menus.
- Assist Kitchen Supervisor with food and supply inventory.
- Maintain equipment, utensils, preparation areas, serving areas, and refuse receptacles in a clean and sanitary manner.
- Remove kitchen and dining area refuse.
- Manage Kitchen Helpers in conjunction with the Kitchen Supervisor.
- Other tasks as assigned.

Nursing volunteers must have a current RN or LPN license.

We must strictly adhere to camper to counselor ratios, so we are asking for volunteers for entire sessions. The sessions with the most volunteers needed are Sessions 7 and 8. Please see the camp calendar for session dates. We also need to know the number of volunteers for each session at least two weeks prior to the session in order to determine our maximum camper count for the session.

- Assisted Living 6 Day Sessions June 11 16, June 25 30, and July 9 11

As we end this year, I would like to offer some suggestions as you prepare for next year:

- Contact those members who left in the past two years and invite them back or suggest that they try a different club. Remember that the membership and transfer fee waiver ends June 30.
- Plan a Membership Growth Event for the summer. LCI has a valuable resource on the Global Membership Approach resource pages that provides very detailed instructions on how to plan and host a successful event.
- If your club hasn't reported on MyLion, contact PDG Lance for assistance or PDG Tom Gregg to walk you through the process to report ONE project.
- Ask EVERY club member what they like or dislike about meeting logistics, speakers, fundraisers, and service projects and ask for their suggestions. Keep this anonymous but use the responses to set goals for next year.
- Speaking of goals, include the district goals as part of your club's plans.
- Did you report your new officers to LCI? If you need help, contact PDG Dave DeFazio. Equally important is to train and mentor these new officers. Encourage them to attend training sessions because things change.
- Encourage members to watch the LCIF Telethon on June 5 and make a personal donation. Every dollar counts, so, \$5 or \$10 is greatly appreciated.
- Report new members on MyLCI.
- Learn more about the Global Membership Approach; it DOES work!!!
- Prepare a club calendar with meeting dates, as well as dates for service projects and fundraisers and distribute to the members to plan ahead. Remember that service projects should be done at least quarterly.

Again, thank you for all of your dedication and hard work. Finally, I want to thank the **Stewartsville Lions Club** for nearly 50 years of outstanding service to their community. You will be greatly missed.

Service

New Service in the New Lions Year

As the Lions New Lions Year is less than a month away, I thought I would write about looking for new Service opportunities in our communities. We have those projects that our Lions Clubs are each individually known for but now is a good time to consider new ways to make an impact on the community.

Does your Club already do projects that cover all of our Global Causes as Lions — Diabetes, Vision, Hunger, Environment, and Childhood Cancer? If not, maybe starting to focus on one of these areas is where your Club can begin this year. The District already has projects focused in these areas and maybe your Club can find a way to work with one of them.

Do you know about the District 14-E Care-A-Van? The Care-A-Van is both a van and the health screening equipment that District 14-E owns. These screeners include vision and hearing screening devices for both adults and children. In recent years, the Care-A-Van has grown to include a Lions Kidsight program with the purchase of two Spot Vision Screeners. These screeners can be used to detect vision issues on children as young as 6 months old. The detection of these issues can then be followed up with and often corrected. The equipment is not hard to use, and we have Lions that are available to help with training. Remember that anyone working with youth will need to have the necessary clearances to do so.

The Care-A-Van is just one of the projects that the District supports. This may or may not be something your Club wants to spend its time being involved in. How do you know for sure what you should do? Well Lions Clubs International offers a tool to help find some focus for a Club. The Club and Community Needs Assessment offers a way for a Club to begin Service or to find new Service opportunities in the community. The tool helps a Club to recognize its strengths and challenges. The Club can learn what motivates its members to Serve. The Club will also analyze the community needs to learn how to enhance the Service that it does.

With the new Lions Year also comes new Lions Leaders. Club presidents will have the opportunity to lead their Lions Clubs into new Service with projects that they are passionate about. As a member of the Slickville Lion Club I have been able to see our last several Club presidents act on projects that were important to them that are projects that our Club carries on with today. Lion Amanda Remic worked to start the Lions Lunchables Food Backpack program. Lion Liz Henderson reinvigorated our Club's Scholarship program by launching a student of the fall and spring program along with organizing to see that two scholarships are awarded annually — one to a traditional student and one to a student pursing a vocational school. Our current King Lion, Barb Novak, has us working with a project called the Vial of Life. This is a door decal that notifies first responders to a house of additional medical information available inside. If a person is found unresponsive, this additional information allows the responders to have a background of the person, thus allowing them to focus their initial treatments the proper way.

Service ideas can come from all around. Continue to look for ways to help your Club Serve the community and remember that there are resources and partnerships available to help you complete this service. As you complete activities in your Lions Clubs be sure to celebrate your achievements and to report your Club's accomplishments on MyLion.






