


#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governor Message:

#### **WOMEN AND FAMILIES IN LIONS**

"April showers bring May flowers," is a common phrase still quoted today. Although April is classified as the second month of spring, I wasn't convinced as I was scraping frost off my windshield this morning. The ethynology behind the word "Apid," comes from the verb "aperie," which means "to open." It is a common belief the word refers to the season of trees and flowers, which begin "to open" and bloom.

Since April signals a new beginning, why not put this meaning into actual practice? I have fond memories of planting seeds in cardboard egg cartons as a child. Watching daily for progress then planting in May to produce flowers I enjoyed all summer. Since Lions care about our planet, why not begin a new tradition, which will recycle various items, grow a garden and be helpful to natural pollination. The possibility is endless.



A family activity that involves learning by doing will stay with that child forever. Since seed packets are plentiful, why not use your children's creativity in creating seedling pods. A few suggestions, used coffee pods, (I save the grinds and put a small hole in the bottom for drainage). Used milk cartons or egg cartons work fine. I place a tray under my pods, so I can water from the bottom. The used grinds can be worked into soil for acid loving vegetables and flowers. When the weather is warm place in indirect sunlight and bring inside on chilly nights. A bag of potting soil and your project ready. In 7 to 10 days little sprouts should appear and by May your plants will be mature enough for outside planting.

Involve the entire family and assign each member to a different species. Use your imagination to expand this project for a lifetime of great memories!

February's newsletter included the Standard Club Structure diagram to help get clubs on track with new officers within their clubs. Some of the titles are a little different. Keep in mind that the roles of Vice Presidents and Directors should be assigned a specific task at hand for the club. We want to avoid dual roles, but if you club is struggling and there isn't a specific task at hand for the roles of Vice President and Directors then what are their contributions?

It is coming up to the time that PU 101's will need submitted again. When you look over the form for submission of course it needs President, Secretary, Treasurer and 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents. But along with those a Membership and Service Chairperson, LCIF Coordinator and a Club Marketing Communications officer is needed. If your club is struggling to get members to step into those roles or due to low member count unable to fill those roles, consider the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents and any directors. They are officers that most certainly need roles to be actively involved within the club. By assigning these roles, you are ensuring your club is kept up on the most current information and help with those specific roles.

Our club elections are similar in nature but may be executed differently due to individuality that is needed for each club. Unless prohibited by a club's constitution and by-laws, the Standard Club By-Laws permits all Lions Clubs to conduct meetings via alternative meeting formats. This allows each club to choose a method of conducting elections that is suitable for those members. This can be via phone, teleconferencing platform, email, or any other method that is acceptable to the club members.

If your club is fortunate to enlist new members as new team leaders, never forget that it is like venturing into unknown territory for some. Do not anticipate a smooth transition because everyone brings a little of themselves to assigned roles. This in time will bring about changes that work for each individual member to ensure the stability of the role, what is expected, and what is given can be entirely different from one member to another. The point of stepping into a role is to experience the opportunity of improving on oneself while helping others.

With change resistance usually is there. If you must bring about change understand your reasons and goals to help others understand what it is that you are trying to achieve. If you cannot explain yourself and the changes you need to make, how do we expect others around us to accept them?

As we are all experiencing during this pandemic, we must remember that with each new year, there will be new challenges. The sooner we approach our challenges, the quicker we can hopefully overcome them. Take steps to ensure active members become active leaders.

#### Controlling Covid-19 So We Can Get Back to Doing More Service

The development of several Covid vaccinations have helped to start reinstating some normalcy to our lives.

I hope that as you read this you have already been able to be vaccinated or at least start the process if you want to be. If not, I have some information that I have been asked to share with my fellow Lions, friends, and family that might help. Fellow Slickville Lions Club member, Albert Novak Jr., is a Vice President, and Chief Philanthropy Officer at Excela Health. Lion Al shared the following information, and I am sharing it with you now:

Excela Health has created a Vaccine Registry located

at <a href="https://vaccinate.excelahealth.org/?Ref=EHWebsite">https://vaccinate.excelahealth.org/?Ref=EHWebsite</a> or <a href="www.excelahealth.org">www.excelahealth.org</a>, and click on COVID-19 vaccine information to find the Registry. As vaccine becomes available, registrants will be notified to schedule an appointment for vaccination in accordance with the Pennsylvania Department of Health guidelines.

Individuals may also call the Excela Health vaccine information line at 724-689-1690. Those who submit information via the web site will receive email notification; callers will be contacted by phone when it's their turn to schedule. The web site offers 24/7 registration while the phone line is open Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. and answers calls on a first come, first served basis.

Excela Health's COVID Vaccine Clinic is located at 8885 Norwin Avenue, North Huntingdon, inside the former Galaxy Fitness Center. Vaccines are administered between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., Tuesdays through Thursdays currently, but hours and days of operation are subject to change as vaccine availability allows. This facility is administering vaccine by appointment only.

Thank you, Lion Al, for what you have provided us here and hopefully soon we will all be all be back to completing Service as Lions without restrictions.

- Pesticides/herbicides, Toxic chemicals like motor oil or oven cleaners
- Prescription drugsAlcoholic beverages

#### Facts about Westmoreland County Food Bank

- Our vision is to end hunger in Westmoreland County.
- Your \$1 donation converts to \$10 of food for us, since we can buy in bulk.
- Your \$5 donation equals 8 meals.
- 96 cents of every dollar is used for food.
- \$65 is our average cost for one family's monthly food box.
- For 35 years we have served the needy in Westmoreland County.
- We have distributed, annually, approximately 7 to 8 million pounds of food through our programs.
- We serve as many as 7200 households or approximately 16,500 individuals each month through our 44 pantry sites and 22 other agencies, including soup kitchens, child care programs and 4 shelters.
- Approximately 4000 are children, who are considered at risk and in need of nutritious food to develop properly.
- Many are the working poor, seniors, disabled or unemployed.
- Approximately 50% of our food is acquired through federal and state programs. The rise in the cost of food, transportation and utilities, an increase of people needing food, in addition to the loss of federally purchased commodities has created the "perfect storm" for food banks across the United States.
- We must depend on food drives and the support of the community to meet our needs.
- We are partners with Feeding America, the nation's food bank network. United Way of Westmoreland County as well as, Feeding PA and PA Association of Regional Food
- We are governed by a volunteer board of directors and have 22 staff.
- We advocate for the poor and are actively involved in legislations both at the state and federal levels.
- Over 6,000 valued volunteers gave a total of approximately 100,000 hours of service last year.



#### Warning to all Lions!

There is a common scam going around recently where criminals attempt to impersonate District and Club Leaders in order to try and trick unsuspecting individuals into sending them gift cards.


The method by which they attempt this scam is simple. They find district information on roster books that are posted online and then "clone" a Lion leader's email. They then send an email to unsuspecting Lions requesting help for those in need.

It is important to note they have not "hacked" that email, they are simply taking a new email and are putting the name of the person they are impersonating into the contact details.

If you get an email from someone asking you to buy gift cards, stop and click on the name of the person. When you do so - you will see it's coming from a fake email. Below are pictures of an email that is going around and then if you click on the sender, you can then see the actual email address which you can see is bogus.

Protect yourself from these scams by educating yourself on how they work! Always verify that the person sending you an email is legitimate.






